**Motorcycle Training Center Signs Contract Addendum
For Reinstatement as CMSP Site Administrator**

Irvine, Calif., Oct. 18, 2004 – In a contract addendum signed by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) and the Los Angeles-based Motorcycle Training Center, Inc. (MTC), the MSF has, on behalf of the California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP), revoked its termination of MTC’s Site Administrator Agreement.

In its September 10, 2004 termination letter, MSF exercised its right under the Site Administrator Agreement to terminate the contract, effective November 9, 2004, but invited MTC to meet with MSF to discuss a possible probationary reinstatement. In early October, MSF and MTC met and agreed to terms under which MTC could be reinstated.

According to the terms of the addendum, MTC has agreed to comply with contractual quality assurance requirements and to adhere to standards as approved by the California Highway Patrol (CHP) and detailed in the CMSP Site Administrator Agreement, the CMSP Policy and Procedures Guide, and the MSF RERP Agreement. MTC has also agreed to implement a number of site improvements and reporting procedures directly related to better serving the needs of students and prospective students.

“We’re pleased that the Motorcycle Training Center has indicated its willingness to meet or exceed the quality assurance standards that are set forth in their contract with the CMSP,” said MSF General Manager Charlie Fernandez. “MSF will continue to enforce standards related to curriculum and contractual agreements with training providers, on behalf of not only the CMSP and the CHP, but most importantly, on behalf of the students.”
